Welcome to David Buck, PACOM CPA: We are delighted to have David Buck as our CPA. His exceptional skills and dedication to his role have contributed significantly to the financial well-being of PACOM. We are fortunate to have him on board.

Board Approval for a Loan: The board's decisive vote in favor of a loan (with five votes supporting it) demonstrates our commitment to the financial stability necessary for the success of our initiatives. However, we first need approval for an 8-story building to obtain that loan.

Appointment of Richard Turski as Chairman of Membership: Richard Turski has taken charge, diligently working to compile a comprehensive list of paid members. This effort is crucial for ensuring transparent and smooth future elections. It would be best to remember that according to the PACOM constitution, only a member in good standing who has been a paid member for at least 6 months can vote and run for office in the elections.

The membership fee will be increased to \$100 starting January 2024: This step ensures a more robust financial foundation, enabling PACOM to thrive and fulfill our collective vision.

Agreement with Mrs. Sweet from Polish National Alliance: We have successfully reached an agreement with Mrs. Sweet, demonstrating mutual understanding and cooperation. This positive development brings us one step closer to obtaining approval for the 8-story building.


The December holiday season holds a special place in the hearts of many people for several reasons, transcending cultural and religious boundaries. For Polish people living abroad, particularly in the United States, the December holiday season becomes a poignant connection to their roots and cultural heritage. Embracing Polish traditions during this time provides a sense of continuity, allowing individuals to share their heritage with family and friends, creating a bridge between their past and present. In a different cultural landscape, these traditions become a source of comfort, identity, and a way to maintain a solid connection to their Polish heritage.

Advent: The four weeks leading up to Christmas are marked by Advent, a time of preparation and reflection. Many Polish households have an Advent wreath with four candles, one of which is lit each Sunday leading up to Christmas.

Mikolajki (St. Nicholas Day): Celebrated on December 6th, St. Nicholas Day is a time for gift-giving. Children leave their shoes out, and St. Nicholas fills them with small presents, sweets, and sometimes a twig for those less than well-behaved.

Christmas Eve (Wigilia): Christmas Eve is the most significant day in Polish Christmas celebrations. Traditionally, a meatless meal is prepared, starting with breaking the Christmas wafer (oplatek) and sharing good wishes. The meal includes a variety of dishes like barszcz (beetroot soup), pierogi (dumplings), and kutia (a sweet grain pudding) Midnight Mass (Pasterka): Attending Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve, known as Pasterka, is a common tradition. The Mass is beautifully decorated with nativity scenes, and the singing of carols is a cherished part of the service.

Christmas Day and Second Day of Christmas: Christmas Day is typically a quieter day spent with family. The Second Day of Christmas, known as St. Stephen's Day, is also a public holiday; some families continue their celebrations. New Year's Eve (Sylwester): New Year's Eve is celebrated enthusiastically in Poland. Many attend parties and fireworks displays or gather in city squares for public celebrations. Epiphany (Trzech Króli): On January 6th, Epiphany, or Three Kings' Day, is celebrated. It marks the end of the Christmas season, and in some regions, there are parades with participants dressed as the Three Wise Men.
